

UMCOR Hygiene Kits

UMCOR has issued a challenge to raise 10,000 hygiene kits. LHUMC and the NCCP are answering that challenge with plans to pack 1000 kits. There is a great need for these basic items due to the many recent natural disasters including floods, hurricanes and wild fires. These kits can be economically packed when the items are purchased in bulk. Items can be purchased from the Amazon wish list (see the QR code) or through donations to LHUMC with a notation for "HYGIENE KITS". Each kit will cost \$5.75 which includes the cost of items and the shipping from the distribution center to the disaster location. (If items are purchased individually the cost is \$14.00). A little goes a long way when we work together. How many kits will you sponsor? The kits will be assembled in a Parrish packing party at LHUMC much like when we packed cleaning buckets. During that packing party we packed 203 5-gallon buckets in 15 minutes. Many hands make light work. Plan to be there. You don't want to miss this! Watch for this date.


Prayer Shawls & Blankets




