Hygiene kits can make a difference between sickness and health to many locally, nationally and around the world. This year, we (being 40 volunteers) made 5 1-day mission trips to New Windsor, where we assembled and prepared over 9,200 kits for shipment.. It wasn't just the work that made this experience so special, but the fellowship, sharing delicious snacks, stopping at Baughers or Hoffmans for food and ice-cream. Most important is that by giving of your time, you made a difference in the lives of many people.






Saturday, Nov. 29th -Annual Outside Tree lighting at Solley-4pm - singing, light refreshments-best Hot Cocoa around!

New study begins November 9 A Child is Born by Amy-Jill Levine--the study considers the Christian story to show us how Scripture's earlier birth stories anticipate the story of Jesus's birth and how the birth resonates and gives new meaning to those earlier stories.



In a time when trust feels fragile and divisions run deep, The Will to Dream calls us into holy longing—a sacred desire for a world made whole. Rooted in prophetic imagination, this Advent–Epiphany series helps communities confront despair, embody justice, and claim hope as a radical act. Together, we learn to dream not as escape, but as spiritual resistance—shaped by the visions of Isaiah, the song of Mary, and the stories surrounding Jesus' birth. Join us this Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany, as we turn to the wisdom of the prophets, lament systems that value power over people, and dream of what could be.




